



IELTT Certificate in EFL Teaching Practice

Programme: Outline

Pre-arrival: Teaching placements are finalised and the Student is issued with contact details of the placement and their local contact / mentor.

The students are issued with a 'log' book to record observations and comments about lessons delivered. The log book will form a vital part of the student assessment.

Day 1: The students meet at IELTT for a briefing and are taken to their placement schools to attend classes observing teaching. Students will also be told what lessons (6 hours teaching) they will need to prepare to teach.

Day 2: Students attend IELTT all day - lesson planning, classroom management training and practicing teaching. The students develop their lesson outlines and practice delivering the lessons to their peer group.

Day 3: Students attend their school and spend time with the placement mentor checking that the first 3 hours of lesson plans are suitable. During the course of the day, they will teach the 3 hours of lessons and get feedback from the observing teacher(s). The school will also provide feedback to IELTT. Further lesson planning as necessary in the evening.

Day 4: Students attend their school and spend time with the placement mentor checking that the last 3 lessons of lesson plans are suitable. During the course of the day, they will teach the 3 hours of lessons and get feedback from the observing teacher(s). The school will also provide feedback to IELTT.

Day 5: Students return to IELTT and receive feedback on their performance – what went well and what needs further development. The programme will round off with last thoughts, ideas and suggestions as to how the Students can continue to improve as teacher practitioners.

Certificates will be issued to student who in the view of IELTT and their placement school have shown the qualities expected in a newly qualified teacher.
